NParks' Garden in Singapore



BUTTERFLY OBSERVATION WALK

This garden has been planted with grasses and wildflowers that attract and provide food for butterflies, caterpillars and other insects.

Stroll through the Butterfly Observation Walk to observe different species of butterfly host and nectar plants.

Yellow Cow Wood
(*Cratoxylum cochinchinense*)

This is a native medium-sized tree with smooth light brown bark and droopy foliage. Its small fragrant flowers are deep crimson or pinkish-yellow and are pollinated by bees and butterflies. Its leaves are known to provide food for caterpillars of the Archduke (*Lexias* sp.) and Common Grass Yellow (*Eurema hecabe*) butterflies, while its brown oval fruits are attractive to birds.



Bunga Tahi Ayam
(*Lantana camara*)

This is a multi-branched shrub with rough-hairy leaves that emit a pungent scent when crushed or rubbed. This gives rise to its Malay name, Bunga Tahi Ayam, which means 'Chicken Dung Flower'. Its colourful flowers attract butterflies. The plant also produces two-seeded berries, which ripen from green to deep blue or purple black, and are eaten by birds.



Peacock Flower
(*Caesalpinia pulcherrima*)

This woody shrub is characteristically known for its colourful ornamental flowers, which bloom in combinations of orange, yellow and red throughout the year, especially in sunny conditions. While scentless, its flowers attract bees, butterflies and moths. This plant is easy to grow and commonly planted due to its adaptive abilities.

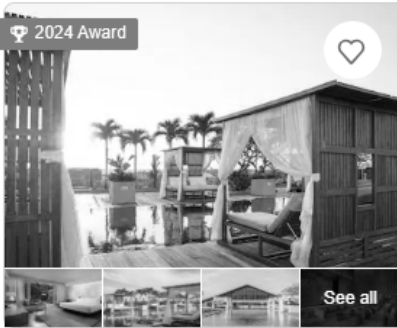
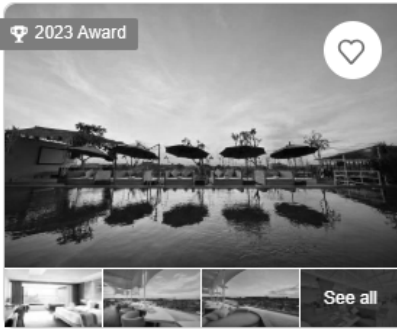

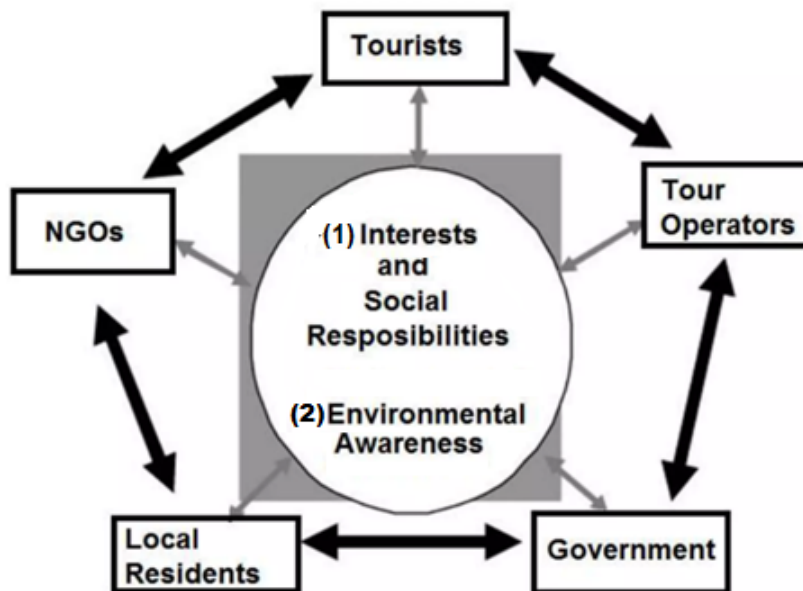
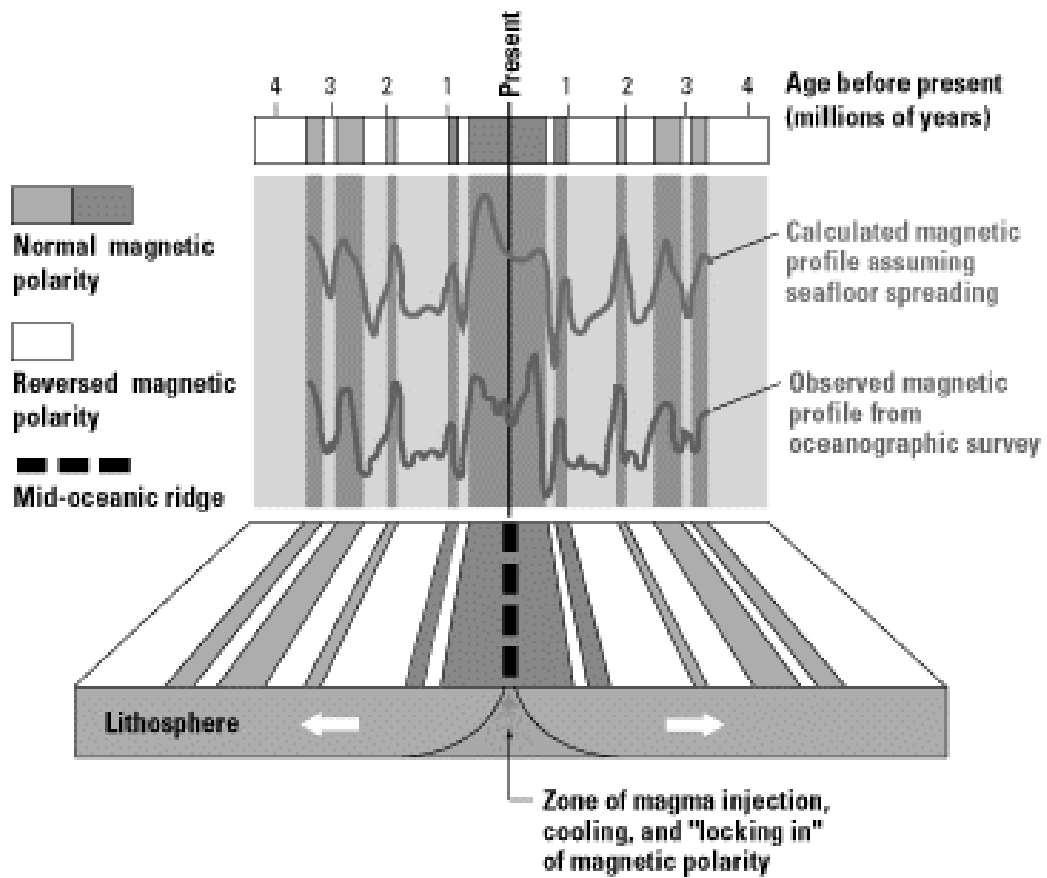
